COUNCILWOMAN PATRICIA WOODBURY ELECTED CHAIR OF THE HAMPTON ROADS TRANSIT BOARD AND VICE PRESIDENT OF VIRGINIA TRANSIT ASSOCIATION

Newport News, Va., – Newport News Councilwoman Dr. Patricia P. Woodbury has been elected Chair of the Transportation District Commission of Hampton Roads (Hampton Roads Transit's governing board) and Vice President of the Virginia Transit Association. On June 23rd she was elected to serve a one-year term, effective July 1st, as Chair of HRT's board. She is currently Vice-chair. At the June 10th Virginia Transit Association (VTA) meeting, Dr. Woodbury was elected Vice President for a two-year term, also beginning July 1st.
