Assistant Chief Joseph A. Moore

Assistant Chief Moore joined the Newport News Police Department on December 1, 1979. He was assigned to C-Shift for several years before the department changed to permanent shifts. On December 16, 1986, he was promoted to Lieutenant. As a Lieutenant, he was assigned to Personnel and Recruiting, Vice Narcotics and Patrol. While assigned to Patrol, he served as the Commander of Watch III South, Watch II South as well as Area F and Area E Commander. He also served five years as the Tactical Operations Unit Commander. In October of 2000, he was promoted to Captain and served as the Internal Affairs Commander and then the North Precinct Commander. In January 2005, he was promoted to Assistant Chief and has served as both the Community Operations Commander and, as his last assignment, the Investigations Bureau Commander.

Assistant Chief Moore grew up in Newport News and is a graduate of Denbigh High School and holds a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from Christopher Newport College. He also holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Golden Gate University. Throughout his career he has attended countless training programs and specialty schools. Most notably, he is a graduate of the 178th Session of the FBI National Academy, the 64th Session of the FBI's Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar, the Senior Management Institute for Police at Boston University and the Professional Executive Leadership School at the University of Richmond.

Assistant Chief Moore is married to the love of his life, Deborah. They are members of St. Jerome's Catholic Church and reside in Newport News. He retired on January 1, 2019 with 39 years and 1 month of service. He plans to fill his retirement days staying busy working on all the projects and hobbies he has not been able to do while working.
